MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2015-16

Memorandum of Understanding between Ministry of Culture, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi & The Sangeet Natak Akademi for the year 2015-16

- 1. The agreement made this 2nd day of March 2015 between the MoC, as the first party and <u>Sangeet Natak Akademi</u>, <u>New Delhi</u> an organization under the Ministry of Culture, hereinafter called the second party.
- 2. Whereas the Ministry of Culture has the following mandate_____
- 3. And where the Sangeet Natak Akademi have the following mandate:

Purpose of the MOU

To achieve the organization goals by optimum use of the funds available and proper functioning of the organization.

To achieve this, the following deliverables are required:

1. Budget / Accounts

(i) Proposed Budget for the year 2015-16 amounting to Rs 8147.19 lakhs (Plan – Rs 3890; Plan NE – Rs. 2605.19; Non-Plan – Rs 1652.00) by Sangeet Natak Akademi for carrying out organizational work. Quarterly target shall be - 1st quarter – Rs 1387 lakh; 2nd quarter – 2686 lakh; 3rd quarter – Rs 2686 lakh; and 4th quarter – Rs 1388.19 lakh.

*The figures shown on the basis of proposed budget for the financial year 2015-16 and activities will be undertaken on the actual allocation by the Ministry of Culture



- (ii) The Annual Report and Audited Account for the year 2015-16 shall be submitted by 15th December, 2016.
- iii) The CAG audit, if required to be done for the year 2015-16 shall be completed by September, 2016.
- iv) Utilization Certificate for Rs 8147.19 shall be submitted to the Ministry by July, 2016.
- v) All pending CAG audit paras and internal audit paras shall be disposed of by October, 2016.
- vi) Inputs for preparations of EFC/SFC shall be submitted as per directives of MoC

Monthly report shall be submitted to Ministry of Culture for the previous month by 1st week of the next month.

2. Human Resource

Project in Varanasi along with HRIDAY and PRASAD

On the occasion of the inaugural ceremony of Varanasi mahotsava "Sanskriti" at Varanasi on 25h December 2014 Hon'ble Prime Minister laid emphasis on exploring the rich cultural legacies of Varanasi at the ground level i.e. amongst the younger generation. It was stated that varanasi is a cultural capital and one of the ancient cities of the country as wells as of the world with its inherent traditional music and dance art forms and various other styles of popular Gharanas. Thus Varanasi has a vast repertoire of cultural material on literature as well as music, and dance for study and research by the younger generation as well as the tourists. It was stated that the purpose of tourists visiting Varanasi should not be confined to visiting the ghats and other tourist spots, but also to observe and disseminate the literature on performing arts, music and dance archived in this ancient cultural city of varanasi.

To put into practice the vision of our Hon'ble Prime Minister, it is proposed that the Akademi may highlight the ancient cultural heritage of Varanasi by way of disseminating the life and work of eminent personalities in the field of performing arts among the youths and school going children up to class XII th standard. In this context, we are planning to disseminate the life and work of eminent artists of Banaras, who were popular and synonymous with Banaras as well as India, like Ustad Bismillah Khan, Pandit Ravi Shankar, Sitara Devi, Pandit Kishan Maharaj, Munshi Premchand and Patanjali.

As a first step in giving shape to the vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister, we have to locate some schools in Varanasi from where we can start the awareness programme and educate the students with regard to music, dance traditions of varanasi. For this purpose a local coordinator has to be engaged and further to teach the music dance forms, a few local teachers, well versed in the style of banaras gharanas in the field of shehnai, tabla, kathak dance and Hindustani vocal music may be engaged and a course for the same prepared in consultation with eminent artists /gurus of Banaras Gharanas.



Apart from the school programmes, we may also start teaching students under the 'guru shishya parampara' in shehnai playing, tabla playing, dance and vocal music of Banaras Gharana as well as in specific styles of Ustad Bismillah khan, Pandit Kishan Maharj, Smt Sitara Devi and Girija Devi. We may thus produce good artists who will carry their guru's traditions and will disseminate their styles for posterity.

To begin with the school level and to explore the cultural heritage of Banaras's music dance styles by way of engaging a local coordinator and teaching faculty, if approved, a budget provision for the same may be forwarded to the ministry of culture at the earliest for their approval in this regard.

As directed by the Secretary, follow up action on the Varanasi Mahotsava "Sanskriti" and to formulate the vision of the our Honb'le Prime Minister as well as long pending Shehnai teaching and making training programme, may have to be started very soon in the month of March 2015. Simultaneously the Akademi may also highlight the ancient cultural heritage of Varanasi by way of disseminating the life and work of eminent personalities of Banaras in the field of performing arts (like Ustad Bismillah Khan, Pandit Ravishankar, Vidushi Sitara Devi, Pandit Kishan Maharajin) Munshi Premchandar and Patanjali among the youth and school going children up to class XIIth standard.

In this regard we have written a letter to Shri Prem Chand Hombal, HOD Performing Arts, faculty of BHU for local coordination and to Vice- Chancellor of BHU for suitable place in BHU campus to start this project. Further it may be stated that the undersigned as per direction of the Secretary met Shri Yugal Kishore Mishra of Jnana- Pravaha, Samane Ghat at Delhi and discussed with him for a suitable place for gallery of Musical Instruments at Jnana- Pravaha and place for office space for the Varanasi project. He stated that for gallery of Musical Instruments he will discuss it in the Board meeting of Jnana- Pravaha, and for office space he has offered his own house which is nearby Sigra at Varanasi. It is therefore suggested that we may identify a suitable space to start this project as well as the whole project of Varanasi - Shehnai teaching/making, Dukkad/ Tabla making and teaching programme at Varansi.
